Minutes of the Annual General Meeting

Trinity Community Lutheran Church
Sunday March 1, 2020

Opening prayer: Father Chuck Cannon

Call to Order: Louise Cassidy called us to order at 12:45 p.m.

Quorum: 22 members present (quorum is 11). See attached membership list.

Approval of minutes from last year's AGM: moved Dorothy, seconded Carol, carried.

Church Administrator's Report: Louise. See attached report.

Treasurer's Report and Budget: Bob. See attached Treasurer's report and attached Budget.

Daily Bread (Daglet Brauth) Society Report: Dorothy. See attached report.

Worship and Music: Gina. See attached report.

Building and Grounds: Bob. See attached report. Comments that it is very dark at the bottom of the ramp into the parish hall at night. Possibly turn motion sensor light so that it illuminates this area better? Also curled-up edges of rugs in various parts of sanctuary and hall can cause tripping hazards. Can we attach rugs securely to floor or purchase new rugs?

Trinity Church Choir and Community Choir: Andy. See attached report.

Trinity Chamber Concert Series: Lucy. See attached report. More concerts are coming up. Border issues are having more and more impact on musicians. Some groups cannot come across the border to perform, so Lucy is organizing concerts at the United Church or other venues in Tsawwassen. Suggest that we establish a bank account in a Canadian bank for depositing revenue of concerts held in Canada, so that we can pay bills in Canada without losing on the exchange rate.

Summer Musical Performance: Dorothy. See attached report.

Healing Through Movement: Shirley. See attached report.

Reading, Prayer and Meditation plus Reaching Out with Cards: Bev. See attached report.

Healing Touch: Gina. See attached report.

Continuing on Council: Robin Holland, Bob Culbert, Greg May, Margriet Warren, Joan Ross. Nominations for Church Council: none today. Note that we will need new council



members next year as all 5 of the above continuing members' terms will conclude next year.

Willing to Serve on Council again: Louise Cassidy, Rosemary Thorne. Moved Joan, seconded Father Chuck, that we elect both Louise and Rosemary to another 2 year term, carried.

Other Business:

Special thank you to Darrell Cassidy for the beautiful posters he has created for our concerts!

New Quilts: 2 new quilts will be hung once they have been prepared for hanging (backing material and hanging rods). One quilt will replace an older one that is currently hanging in the hallway, with permission from the quilter to take it down. We will get help from fire department to hang them.

Hearing problems: Shirley has been informed that people can't always hear the speaker in the sanctuary. There is a microphone on pulpit and two hanging mikes in sanctuary. Committee to investigate sound options for sanctuary. Reminders to all readers, speakers, etc. to speak slowly and clearly.

Heritage designation for church building: Carol. There might be funds available to help with upkeep of building; however, heritage designation may mean that we cannot change anything, and sometimes things need to be changed. Louise will inquire of Barb Wayland and Historical Society.

Border issues: We need to be clear about what our Canadian members are allowed to do when they come to church. The wording is important: Canadians are not allowed to volunteer, but, as members of the church, they are allowed to do ordinary things that all members do (sing, pray, etc.)

Garbage Clean-up: Abby suggests that we undertake to do garbage clean-up as part of our community service. Louise notes that several groups and businesses already do regular garbage pick-ups, but there is always more needing to be done. Louise will give Abby the contact numbers for Sustainable PR, who coordinates this. We will be glad to help.

It takes a lot of people to host one small service.

We held special services on March 5th for Shrove Tuesday/Ash Wednesday, April 14th Palm Sunday, 18th Maundy Thursday, 19th Good Friday, 21st Easter Sunday, October 6th was Blessing of the Animals prior to services, Christmas Eve with Father Chuck, Christmas Day Andy & Bev led Lessons & Carols.

The Church Hall has regular use every Monday & Wednesday for "Healing Through Movement" with Shirley Cannon. The first and third Sundays are "Healing Touch" with Gina Gauder. The third Thursday is "Reading, Prayer, Meditation" with Rev. Bev Mar. Once a month the "Point Roberts Quilt Group holds their meeting in the hall and once or twice a month a group gets together to sew for the day.

Special uses of the hall and sanctuary were three celebrations of life, one baptism, one wedding, a dedication of a painting of Kolbeinn Simundsson and in September the Whatcom Cluster held their meeting here.

Music continues to be a big part of our outreach. Trinity Chamber Concert Series produced by Lucy Willimas (as a fundraiser for the Summer Musical Performance) held eight events. Power of Music Video Presentation held six events. Trinity Community Choir performed a Spring and Winter concert. You will hear more on this from individual reports. On February 3rd a Bluegrass Concert was held.

We advertise in the All Point Bulletin, PAWS, Point Interface and Facebook for all our events. Our website is hosted and updated by Susan Harms. Darrell Cassidy continued to support us with graphic design of over 16 posters and 12 ads for the newspaper.

We had 9 participants, 6 of whom were first-timers, and 12 crew members, including 2 crew bosses sharing the duties because of scheduling. Veronica, Caitlin and I co-directed. The campers had lots of fun playing games, being pirates and angels and learning dance moves and singing their hearts out. The crew had a fabulous time together creating costumes and sets and props for the musical, and leading games with the campers. They enjoyed a crew party hosted by Linda Hughes in Point Roberts, and so many crokinole games!

Dorothy Bayley was our in-house dietary diva, providing healthy snacks for the cast and crew every day.

A highlight for me was having Gaspar's grandsons, Alex and Pierre, able to fully participate and thrive during the week with us. Both Alex and Pierre had had a very difficult year health-wise, and for Alex to play the lead with such energy, and Pierre to be part of crew where he was so appreciated made me extremely grateful for the opportunity to make a difference in these boy's lives. Their mom reported that her 'kids came back from camp more grown up and happy and more confident'.

The musical camp would not be possible without the fundraising efforts of Lucy and her concert series. I am so grateful for all of her work in making sure the participants are able to come to camp for free.

Report from "Healing Through Movement" 2019

After much deliberation it was decided to use the name "Healing Through Movement" as our public name to better describe what we are about. To those of us who already know, we find "Knee club" is easier to say in a conversation.

Knee Club begins it's sixth year in March, and it's third year being held in the church hall. How many lives have we touched? I've lost count, but 29 people came to the Knee Club Pot Luck last summer.


Attendance, like everything on the Point is seasonal. Fewer in winter, especially the Bleak Mid Winter.

In December, the council decided after recommendations regarding the church's tax exempt status, to handle all the money donated from the participants, and hire me at a set salary.

Prior to this agreement, Knee Club donated \$108 dollars during the year to cover the use of the room.

In conclusion:

There is one participant for whom this activity is crucial. She is severely disabled, and yet determined to do as much of the exercises as she can. She uses a chair on either side to enable her to stand, and with determination that is inspiring to the rest of us, continues to surprise all of us with her progress. Our own Beverly has made amazing progress from her major heart surgery. It is for these two, and for my Chuck and myself and for the rest of the 7 regulars, (5 of whom are someplace else this time of year,) that I hope to continue Knee Club as long as possible.

Reading Prayer and Meditation Group 2019 *By Rev. Bev Mar*


This year, I organized 9 Trinity RPM – one hour programs in the Community Room of the Church, once a month with about 30 attendees and myself, ranging from 3-5 people a month. The 30 includes many repeat attendees (13 plus myself). The timing of RPM is generally late in the month on a Thursday. Mid-year, we moved to the noon – 1pm time slot, to hopefully attract a few lunch timers. Darrell Cassidy designed wonderful posters for these events and I thank him for all his efforts. My personal favorite was the poster on Celtic Spirituality February 21st, 2019.

The topic of focus varied each month as did the guided meditations. Topics included Beginnings in January, the Spirituality of Water, Bathing in Trees, Celtic Spirituality, the Body Elemental as described by Tanis Helliwell, Affirmations, Giving Thanks (US) Thanksgiving, and Peace Like a River in December. In May we walked a local Labyrinth.

Thanks for all the church support. This year RPM will shift some with the addition of some music and the weekly Lenten Series, which is modeled on the monthly program, tho' expected to be about 45 minutes.

Card Ministry

I have little to report on card ministry, as my records & memory of these activities are rather terrible during the many months of my heart issues. I estimate I sent out about 25 - 30 cards, some hand made and some of the more standard variety. Healing Touch and Healing Ministries 2019



Within the current schedule, the "Healing Space" is open on the first and third Sundays of the month between 1 and 3 PM, with a sign-up sheet provided for people to sign up for a 30-minute session. Donations are received, which go directly to support the programs at Trinity.

Healing Touch is a gentle and nurturing energy therapy which works to balance the energetic systems of the body to improve physical, emotional, mental and spiritual well-being, thus supporting your body's natural ability to heal. HT is effective in reducing stress and decreasing pain, complementing back and neck care; calming anxiety and depression, easing acute and chronic conditions, supporting cancer care and enhancing recovery from surgery. It strengthens the immune system and promotes a sense of general well-being.

Pastor Gina has been using Healing Touch to improve people's lives for over 10 years. She has a private practice in her home, and is delighted to offer this healing and supportive service to our Trinity and Point Roberts community from her Healing Space next to the nursery in the church building.
