TCLC Manager's Report 2017

We are truly blessed with such caring members willing to give their time and talents to help raise awareness of our church's ministries. It has been a very busy year for our congregation as you will hear from all the reports to come.

We had many groups using the church social hall by donation last year. The Point Roberts Quilters once a month, Philosophers Café once a month, Knee Club is twice a week, Tia-Chi is twice a week, a Sewing Group once a month, and a Yoga group once a week. We also had Six Power of Music events, eleven Trinity Chamber Concert Series events, two Trinity Community Choir concerts, Summer Music Camp and Bev Mar lead a Reading & Meditation time once a month. A very busy place. The hall was also used by two community groups for their meetings.

There was one wedding and two memorial services held here. We also had a visit from Icelandic nationals who were hosted by Joan & Sylvia.

Cleaning of the sanctuary and hall was done by Heather Dixon who does a great job. Weeding and trimming of bushes was done by Itoko who also looked after watering the plants during our very dry summer. Lawn care was done by Ravenwood Landscaping, who also helped with other yard clean up.

Susan Harms continues to host our website and posting updates as we send them to her. Bob has been recording the sermons and then sending the file to Susan for posting on the site. We have a Facebook page which is managed by Cynthia Zimbelman. Please "like" our page and send her any pictures you would like posted of church activities. A very big thank you to Darrell Cassidy who donated all his time to design over twenty different posters for our events and groups.

We advertise in the All Point Bulletin every month. We have one ad now that highlights our events and the Trinity Chamber Concert Series events. Darrell Cassidy is designing these for us as well by donation. Gina Gaudet has been writing the monthly column and sometimes has assistance from Bev Mar.

Jean Barrington and Curt Bush continue to monitor the PREP supplies. Our generator is in good working order and was only called into service once this winter.

Regular worship continues ever Sunday with childcare being provided by Nancy King. Special services were held on February 28th for Palm Sunday, March 1st Ash Wednesday, April 13th Maundy Thursday, 14th Good Friday and 16th Easter Sunday. We had special guest Pastor Keith Swenson preach on June 25th and October 9th. December 24th was a busy day with regular morning services lead by Pastor Gina Gaudet and Christmas eve services lead by Father Chuck Cannon.

We had one fundraising event in October called "The Re-gift Sale". Jean Barrington curated all the donations that came in. Thank you to all our volunteers Bob Culbert, Rita Worth, Dorothy Bayley, Joan Ross, Abby Armstrong, Marge, Greg May, Bev Mar, John Worth, Curt Bush and Darrell Cassidy. We raised \$786.66 for the church, not bad for only four hours of selling.

We are still needing the following maintenance items to be budgeted for.

Like:

- Refinishing the sanctuary front doors
- new flooring in narthex
- build proper access door to area under sanctuary
- insulating the sanctuary floor and laying a vapor barrier
- cleaning carpet in upstairs office, stairway and chairs
- strip and wax social hall floors
- wash walls in hall and sanctuary
- solution for gutter clog where buildings meet at entrance door
- refinish decks
- automatic watering of plants
- solar lights for signs at night and walkway to front entrance of sanctuary

Andy and Bob continue to be the regular assistants. Carol and Joan and Shirley have started training to take parts of the assistant work.

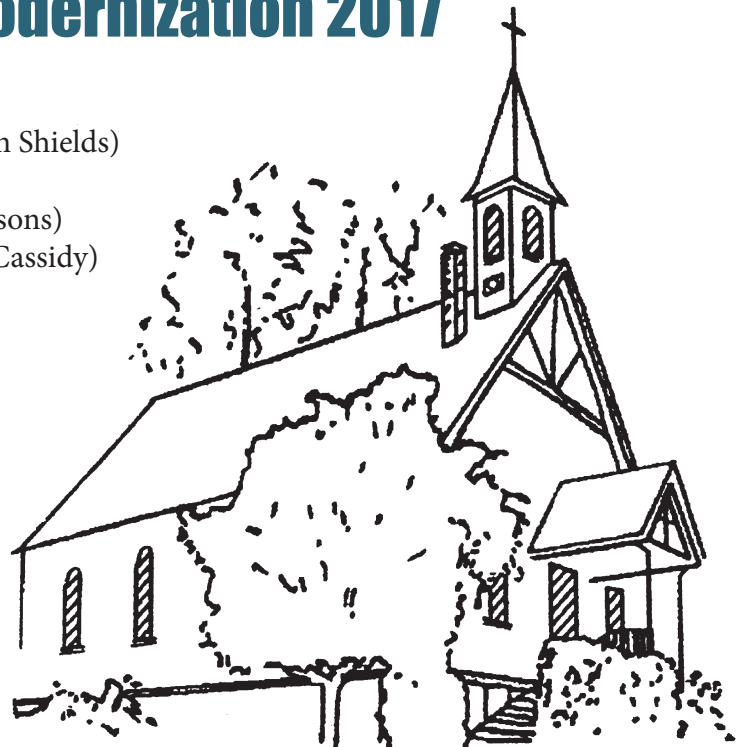

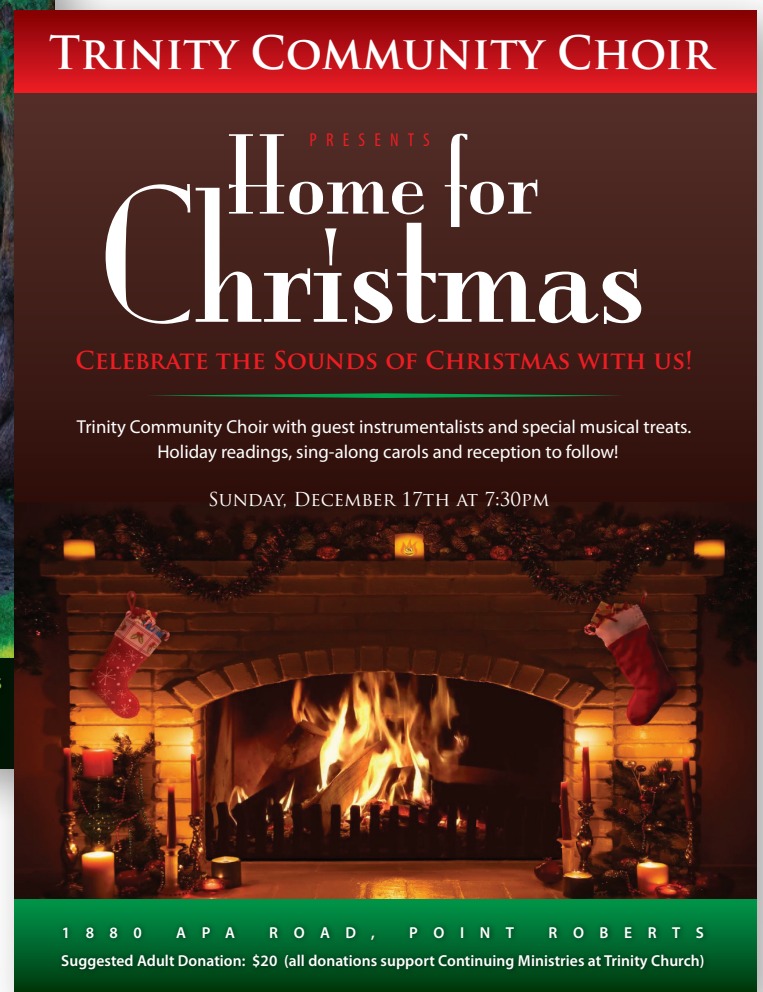
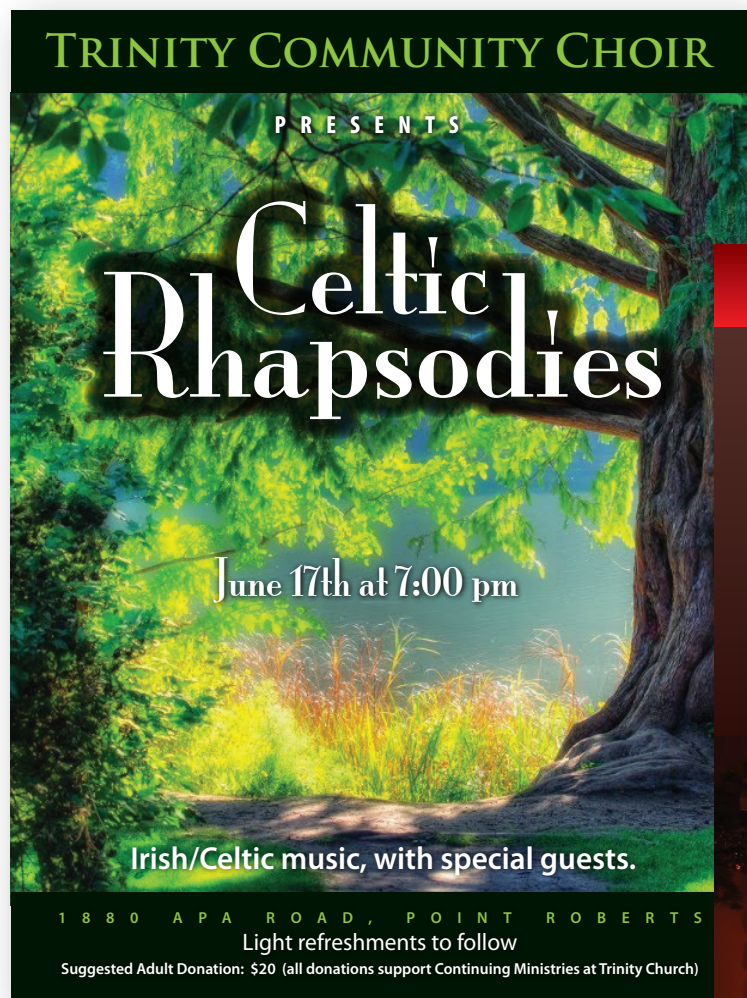
Trinity Community Choir is a self-sustaining group buying music and paying pianist fees from the choir fees.

Andy Mar continues to do all the work to run the choir. We are so very blessed to have him.

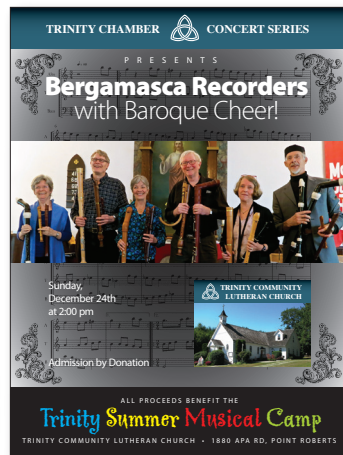
All the donations from the concerts benefit the music ministries at Trinity Church, including the Summer Musical Camp.

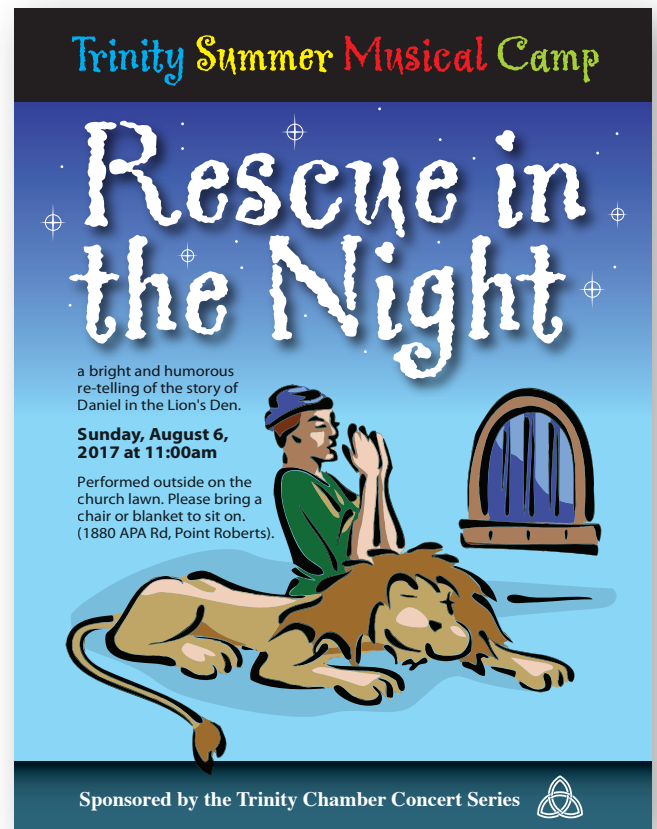


Summer Musical Camp

- this year's musical was *Rescue in the Night*, the story of Daniel in the Lion's Den
- there were 10 participants and 12 crew including the crew boss
- my co-director, Caitlin, was only able to come on the Sunday and Monday, being close to giving birth to Orson. She did choreograph all the numbers before she left, and helped me give out roles for the campers
- new this year was a crew party on the Friday evening starting with a talent show, which allowed the crew to share with each other skills they normally wouldn't have known about. Veronica did an amazing job at being encourager and cheerleader to all, making everyone feel very special.
- my niece, Kiara Strijack did a beautiful job as crew boss
- Veronica Hughes took over Caitlin's position as co-director, teaching the dancing along with her dance captain, Ashton Pawlik
- for the performance Veronica led from the front, while I was on keyboard in the band together with Veronica's husband Drew on drums, Julian on bass and guitar, Nate on bass, and Marilynn on trumpet. Michael, 4, was thrilled to joined for a few numbers on conga drum.
- Dorothy Bayley reprised her role as Dietary Diva, taking care of all of the campers and crew with healthy snacks, some of which were generously provided by members of the congregation and community
- Joan Ross lent her creativity to the costumes and t-shirts, with help from Helen Byer
- we were happy to have the performance here at the church again. The crew created a fabulous back-drop and 'lion's den'
- we were fortunate to have Jonathan on sound- fitting all the campers with head mics
- the performance was filmed this year for the first time for Point Roberts TV, which meant that it was available to view on youtube the very next day!
- it was a very successful week. The campers and crew had a really fun time- children found new confidence they didn't know they had, and new friendships were formed



Youth Philosopher's Cafe

This program began in the fall of 2016 for the teen-age participants in the Summer Music Camp who expressed a desire to continue gathering regularly during the school year.

The group meets once a month. The “*Philosopher's Cafe*” model provides structure for discussion of ethical and moral issues. A selection of philosophical statements, a sort of “what do you think?” provokes thoughtful discussion. Recently we added a “*what would you do?*” component to the mix, including hypothetical moral dilemmas. In addition to stimulating deep consideration of relevant ideas and situations, it is a valuable social gathering, and builds community.

The group comprises youth from Canada and the US, and is open to youth aged 15 to 20. Others from the community attend occasionally. The youth have lately shown interest in meeting more than once a month, and this is a good sign of a valuable and growing ministry.


Youth Philosopher's Cafe, in whatever form it takes over time, continues to be an important outreach of Trinity Church.

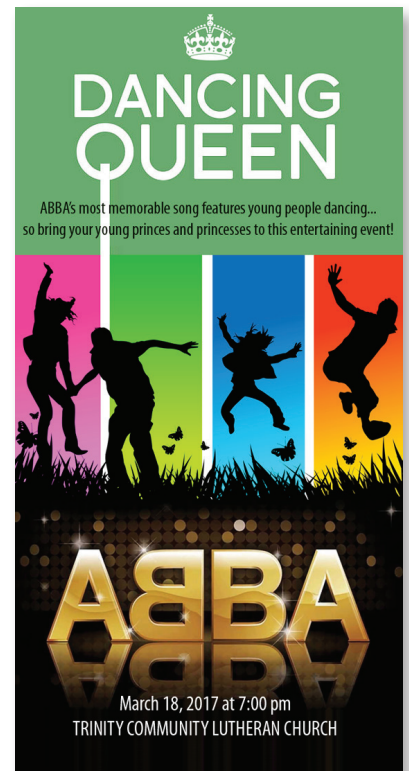
Power of Music Program

This activity began taking place in the Hall at church, twice a week beginning in April of 2017. Attendance like most things in Point Roberts has varied throughout the year. Usually 5 to 10 people, once or twice, 14. The room gets really full with that many people as a yoga mat and a chair are set up for each participant.

It consists of slow moving stretches standing in front of a chair, then sitting in the chair, then standing beside the chair and using the chair for balance. We end with some serious balancing including Warrior poses from Yoga and plank, (with or without push ups) and deep lunges. We sometimes get out of breath and break a sweat. It seems to be too easy for some, and too difficult for others. However, the core 6 to 8 people who have attended regularly report very positive changes in their physical abilities and general health.

Healing Touch and Healing Ministries

Healing is one of the signs of the Kingdom, and has always been important in the history of the Church around the world.

As a Certified HT Practitioner, I offer a variety of techniques that address chronic and acute pain, stress and anxiety. Healing Touch promotes faster healing post-surgery, and supports efforts to eliminate addictions.

HT has previously occurred at the church one Sunday a month, between 1 and 4:30 pm. People from the outside Trinity have booked a Sunday session, or a private appointment during the week. I currently offer this ministry twice a month, from 1 pm, ending at 3.

I have spoken with other members who value healing in their own lives, and realize the need for an expanded healing work based in our church. What this will look like has yet to emerge.

Additionally, a few of our members have participated for almost a year in a weekly group that uses a modality called Emotion Code to promote well-being in ourselves, families and communities through clearing trapped emotions. These emotions can have serious long-term effects on our bodies, minds and hearts. Clearing these trapped emotions can provide healing, personal peace, and an unfolding of spiritual gifts that enhance our lives and the lives of our loved ones. Our hope is to start an Emotion Code group once a month in Point Roberts.

What seems to be emerging is a growth of healing work through church members. This is an exciting time!
